## Home Maintenance Advice for Spring: Avoid Water Issues

Frozen ground, melting snow and Spring rain can be problematic for your home. The following actions should be done every Winter and as Spring approaches.

#### **Inspect the Exterior of Your Home**

Check the foundation for cracks. Make sure rain gutters are attached, cleaned of debris, and they extend at least 6 ft. or more to direct water away from the home

Check the gutters throughout the year - especially before and after storms and when the snow melts in the Spring.

#### **Plug in Your Sump Pump**

Make sure your sump pump is plugged in and working properly if you have one. Check for proper hose connection and check pump hole to be sure it is free of debris.

Clean any floor drains in your home. Make certain the extension hose outside your home for the pump is diverted away from the basement.

#### **Relocate Snow**

Another easy way to prevent Spring flooding of the home is to remove snow away from the home's perimeter after heavy snowfalls.

Consider using a snow blower to blow a path around the home and be sure to blow the snow away from the home and air conditioner, or shovel and move the snow to another area to melt.

## Introducing our New Board Member Zara Wolfe

My name is Zara, I am a single parent of a young child, a social worker, a Two Rivers CLT homeowner, and its newest board member.

Growing up, my family experienced a lot of housing instability, and I was homeless when I was 17-20 years old. I bought my home in November 2021, and this is the first time in my life that I have lived somewhere that truly feels like home. By having permanently affordable housing, Two Rivers CLT has given me the opportunity to give my son a level of stability that I never knew, more financial security than I thought was possible, and peace of mind, knowing that I don't have to worry about where we would live if we got priced out of our rent.

Professionally, I am an Organizer with the Minnesota Coalition for the Homeless; my role focuses on community engagement and ensuring that people with lived experience of homelessness are involved in authentic and meaningful ways in key decision making and leadership spaces. Serving on the Board of Directors is a chance for me to live out my values around people with lived experience being involved in decision making at all levels, use my passion for housing justice in a new way, and volunteer my time to give back to an organization that has already given me so much. I am looking forward to serving on the board and bringing in a CLT homeowner perspective.

I hope another homeowner will join me on the board next year!
